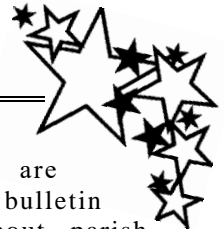

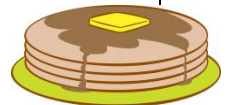


**Bulletin Advertisers**
