**Beatification of Solanus Casey**

Born Bernard Casey on Nov. 25, 1870, Blessed Solanus Casey, an American-born Capuchin priest who died in 1957, was beatified on November 18<sup>th</sup> at a Mass in Detroit. Blessed Solanus Casey is the second American-born male to be beatified. He served for two friaries in New York at Sacred Heart Friary in Yonkers and later in New York City. He was known during his lifetime as a wonderworker, for his great faith, and for his abilities as a spiritual counselor - but especially, for his great attention to the sick, for whom he celebrated special Masses. The friar was much sought-after and came to be revered in Detroit where for 21 years he was porter at St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit and never turned anyone away. He was also a co-founder of Detroit's Capuchin Soup Kitchen in 1929.
