Two-thirds of the very first collection of the Propagation of the Faith in 1822 was sent to the Church in America, making it possible to build churches, schools, educate clergy, provide for the good works of religious communities and support evangelization here at home. In 1908 a papal decree removed the designation "mission territory" from the United States. As we recall our mission history, we are called upon to assist both spiritually and financially the more than 1,150 "young churches" in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and Latin America. Please be as generous as your means will allow this World Mission Sunday.

### **Bereavement Support Group**

Catholic Charities Introduces Bereavement Support Group in New Paltz First Meeting November 5 at St. Joseph's Church

NEW PALTZ – Catholic Charities is introducing a bereavement support group at St. Joseph's Church in New Paltz. The group, especially for individuals who have lost a loved one to the disease of addiction, will meet in the Parish Center Library (lower level) at 34 South Chestnut Street, New Paltz from 7 – 8:15 pm. The first session will be held Monday, November 5. Subsequent meetings are scheduled for November 19, December 17, January 7 and 21, and February 4 and 18. Additional dates will be announced once the group is under way.

Free and open to the community, the meetings will provide a safe environment for those who have lost a loved one to addiction to share and seek support without stigma or judgment. The group will be facilitated by Laura Keller, LMSW.

“Unfortunately, not everyone overcomes their battle with addiction, and we often find that the family members left behind have much to cope with, including grief, guilt, and anger,” said Dr. Dean Scher, CEO, Catholic Charities of Orange, Sullivan, and Ulster. “But there’s no need for loved ones to go it alone. This bereavement support group, led by a highly experienced facilitator, offers an outlet for those who have experienced a loss to talk, share, and be supported along with others who have shared the same experience.”
